

World Spring Migration Day Hike

This year's annual World Spring Migration Day Hike will be held on Saturday, May 13 at Sugar Creek Bluff Natural Area. Spring migratory birds often seen and heard on this beautiful hike include many warblers, grosbeaks, orioles, and indigo buntings. The event is sponsored by the Mississippi Valley Conservancy as part of their Linked to the Land series. Expert birders will serve as guides for small groups. Ferryville Tourism Council is the host for the groups, and we are so thankful for our partnership with the MVC. They have crews who regularly do clearing of invasive species on this property. It is a gorgeous, gradual hike of one and a half miles roundtrip through the woods to a blufftop overlook of the Mississippi River.

Meeting time for this hike is 7 AM at the trailhead along the north side of North Buck Creek Road. Signs on Hwy. 35 just south of Ferryville will direct you to the property.
